Definitions

- "Graduates Employed in the Field" means graduates who beginning within six months after a student completes the
 applicable educational program are gainfully employed, whose employment has been reported, and for whom the
 institution has documented verification of employment. For occupations for which the state requires passing an
 examination, the six months period begins after the announcement of the examination results for the first examination
 available after a student completes an applicable educational program.
- "Placement Rate Employed in the Field" is calculated by dividing the number of graduates gainfully employed in the field by the number of graduates available for employment.
- "Number of Graduates Taking Exam" is the number of graduates who took the first available exam in the reported calendar year.



- "First Available Exam Date" is the date for the first available exam after a student completed a program.
- "Passage Rate" is calculated by dividing the number of graduates who passed the exam by the number of graduates who took the reported licensing exam.

- "Salary" is as reported by graduate or graduate's employer.

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STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL

Cancellation notices shall be in writing. Withdrawal may be prompted by the student's written notice or by the student's conduct, including but not necessarily limited to a student's lack of attendance. You may cancel this Enrollment Agreement and obtain a refund of charges paid through the 1st class session or the 7th day after enrollment, whichever is later, by sending a written notice to Tracy Hua, President, 23615 El Toro Road, Suite R1, Lake Forest, CA 92630. If the School has given you any equipment, including books or other materials, you shall return it to the School within 7 days following the date of your notice of Cancellation.

If you fail to return this equipment, including books, or other materials in good condition within the 7-day period, the school may deduct its documented cost for the equipment from any refund that may be due you. Once you pay for the equipment, it is yours to keep without further obligation. Cancellations and refunds will be paid in full within 30 days less any deduction for equipment not timely returned in good condition Sebastopol Massage Center does not currently participate in a federal loan programs.

REFUND INFORMATION

The student has a right to a full refund of all charges less the amount of \$250 for the nonrefundable registration fee if he/she cancels this agreement prior to or on the 1st day of instruction. The amount retained for the nonrefundable registration fee may not exceed two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250).

In addition, the student may withdraw from the course after instruction has started and receive a pro-rata refund for the unused portion of the tuition and other refundable charges if the student has completed 60% or less of the instruction. For example, if the student completes only 30 hours of a 90-hour course and paid \$300 tuition, the student would receive a refund of \$200.

If the student has received federal student financial aid funds, the student is entitled to a refund of the monies not paid from federal student financial aid program funds. If the student has received any grants, monies or scholarships from third parties, the student is not entitled to a refund of that money.

The school will also refund money collected for sending to a third party of the student's behalf such as license or application fees. If the school cancels or discontinues a course or education program, the school will make a full refund of all charges. Refunds will be paid within 30 days of cancellation or withdrawal.
